The A. G. Leventis Gallery brings the grandeur of European art from the Renaissance to the 20th century to the heart of Nicosia, connecting the European continent with its south-eastern outpost by highlighting the unique relationship between art and its history. Anastasios G. Leventis wanted the art he collected and loved during his lifetime to be enjoyed by his compatriots and envisioned a fine arts museum that would make a lasting contribution to his homeland.

The A. G. Leventis Gallery Collection is divided into four thematic collections:

The Paris Collection. Anastasios G. Leventis gathered what is today the A. G. Leventis Foundation's Collection of European Art, in the 1950s, 1960s and early 1970s. In his Paris home, he brought together works from a broad spectrum of the history of art which reflect his personal fascination with different artistic schools and styles, from the Old Masters and academic art to Impressionism and the early days of Modernism, amidst period furniture and a wealth of objects from the decorative arts.

the Greek Collection. The nucleus of this significant collection of works by 19th- and 20th-century Greek artists is made up of the oil paintings, watercolours, drawings and prints acquired by Anastasios G. Leventis in 1973 from Evangelos Averoff-Tossizza. The first catalogue, published in 1989, featured 190 works. Enriched with further acquisitions in the 1990s and 2000s, the Greek Collection today numbers more than 260 works, from the aftermath of the Greek War of Independence in 1821 to around 1970.

The Cyprus Collection. It was only quite recently that the A. G. Leventis Foundation began to collect Cypriot art, with the Board of Trustees deciding that the primary focus should be on the first generation of Cypriot artists, as well as some pieces by artists of the second generation who explored similar themes. Featuring representative pieces by Cypriot artists born between 1884 and 1930, the Collection offers insight into the beginnings and development of modern Cypriot art.

The Gold Collection. A significant new addition to the A. G. Leventis Gallery Collections has opened its doors to the public in January 2020. 605 gold coins and commemorative gold medals form the new 'Gold Collection'. The collection was developed by Anastasios G. Leventis from the early 1960s to 1976 while he was living in Paris and is presented to the public in its entirety for the first time.

THE LEVENTIS MUNICIPAL MUSEUM OF NICOSIA

The Leventis Municipal Museum of Nicosia, inaugurated in April 1989, is housed in a complex of three historic buildings, which have been restored, modified and refurbished in order to meet today's museological standards and to provide a visitor-friendly space, where people can enjoy its Collections.

The Museum was created to present the history of Nicosia, the last divided capital of Europe. It narrates the history of the city from prehistoric times to the present day through its exceptional, rich Collections. More than 10,000 objects, including maps, documents, paintings, engravings and costumes, recount the story of Nicosia. The three floors of the Museum house the permanent exhibition galleries, in chronological order from Ancient Nicosia to the Byzantine and medieval Frankish and Venetian periods, the Ottoman period and the British period, concluding with the Republic of Cyprus and Nicosia today.

The Museum also hosts two private collections of Cypriot and medieval antiquities: the Leto and Costakis Severis Collection and the Chris Phylactou Collection. In addition, the archives of the Museum include extensive photographic material, related mainly to the city of Nicosia and its inhabitants.

In 1991, just two years after it opened its doors, the Leventis Municipal Museum of Nicosia was awarded the European Museum of the Year Award. It is now recognised as one of the leading history museums of Europe and beyond.

In the multidimensional spaces of the Museum, the history of the capital of Cyprus meets the needs of today's visitors, inviting them to interact with the city's past. The Museum organises a series of activities and events to attract people from all age groups and backgrounds. Temporary exhibitions, guided tours, lectures, talks, evening events and educational activities are all designed in a way that links them to the Museum's Collections and the history and social development of Nicosia.
